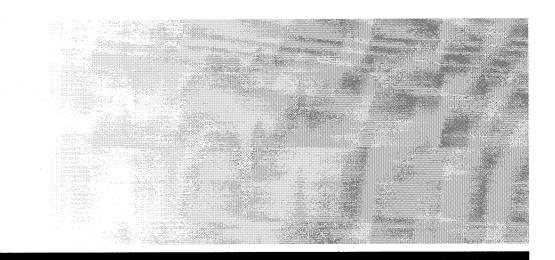

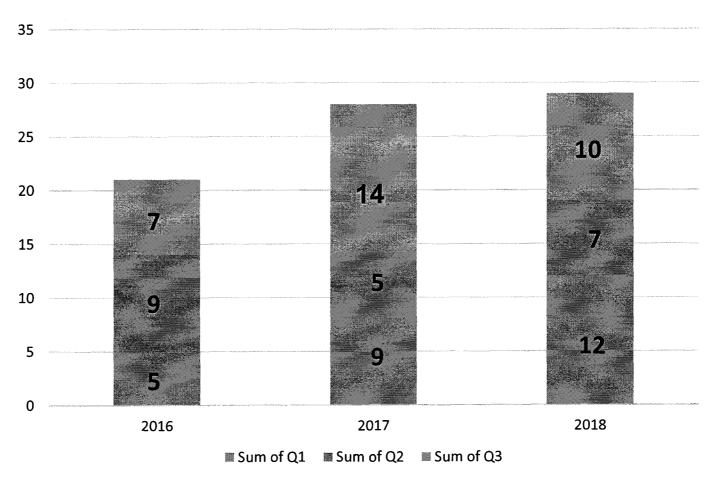

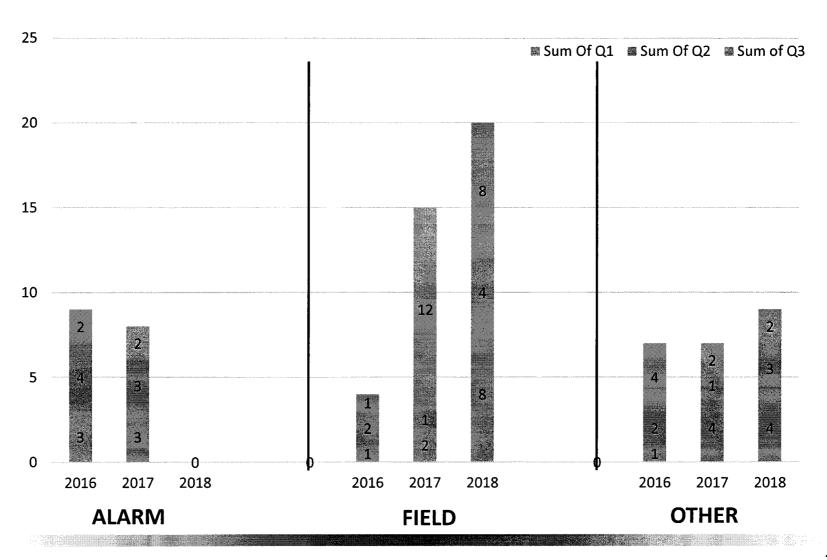


1/1 – 9/30 TURNOVER REPORT



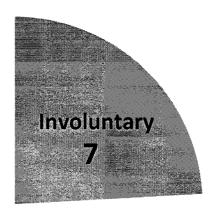


1/1 – 9/30 TURNOVER BY DEPARTMENT





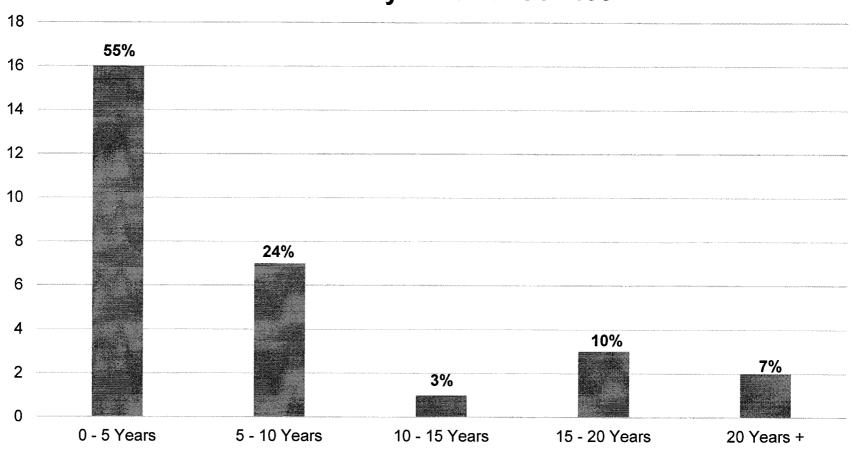
1/1 – 9/30 Voluntary VS Involuntary Turnover

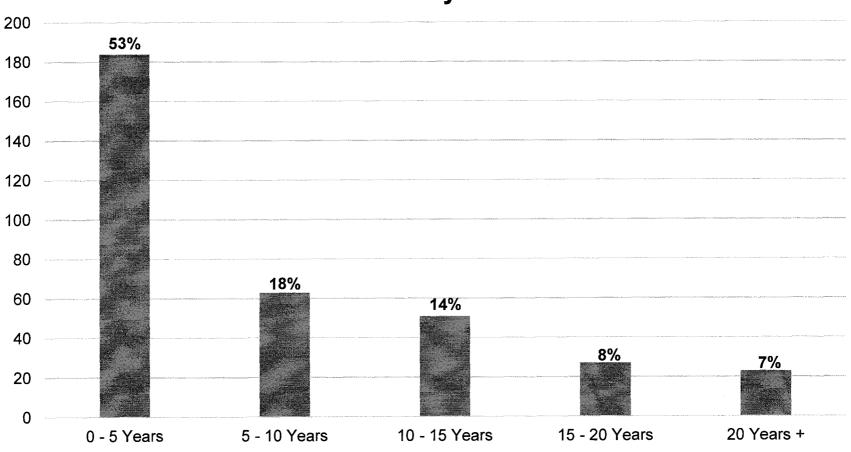


Turnover by Years of Service



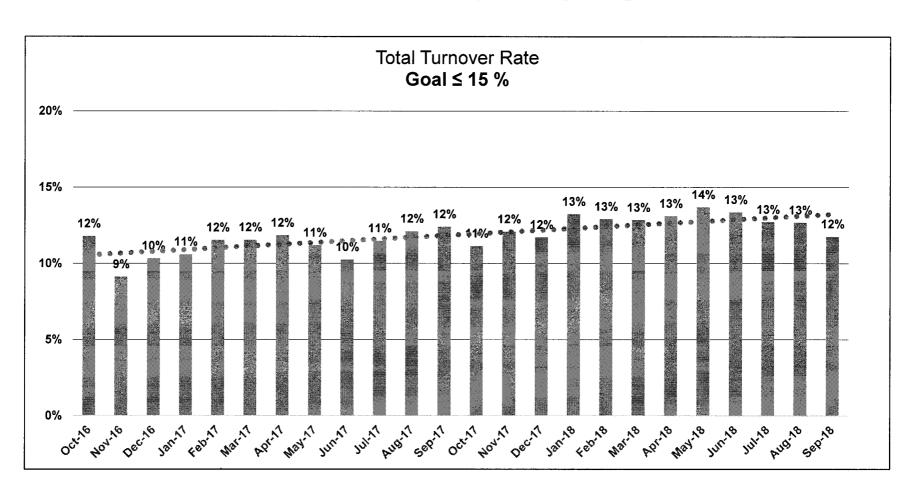


Current Workforce by Years of Service





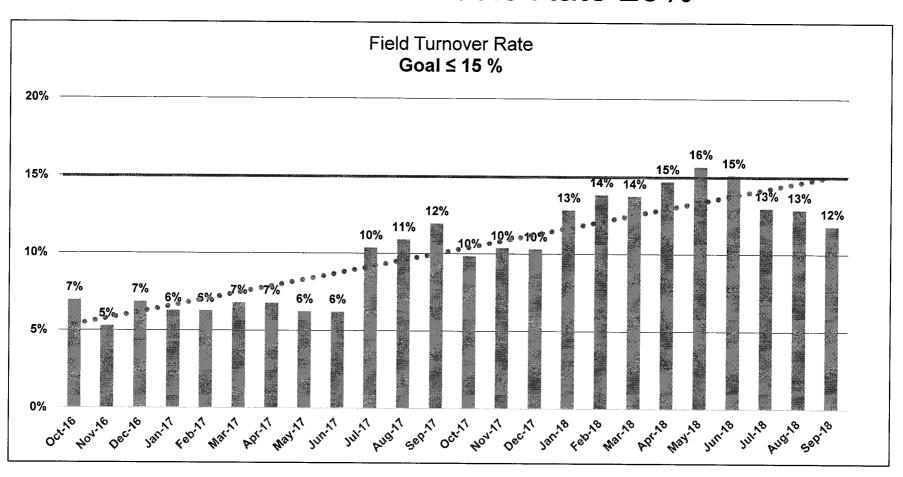

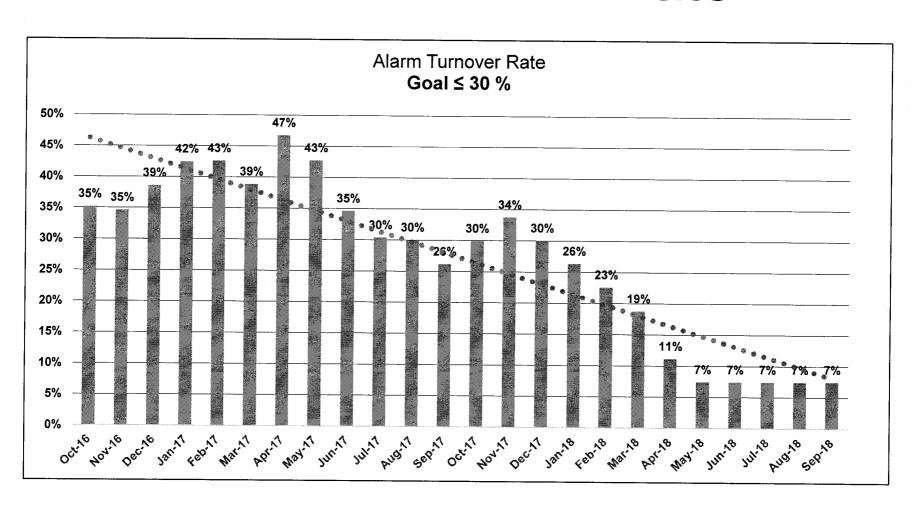
Field Turnover

National Paramedic Rate 25%



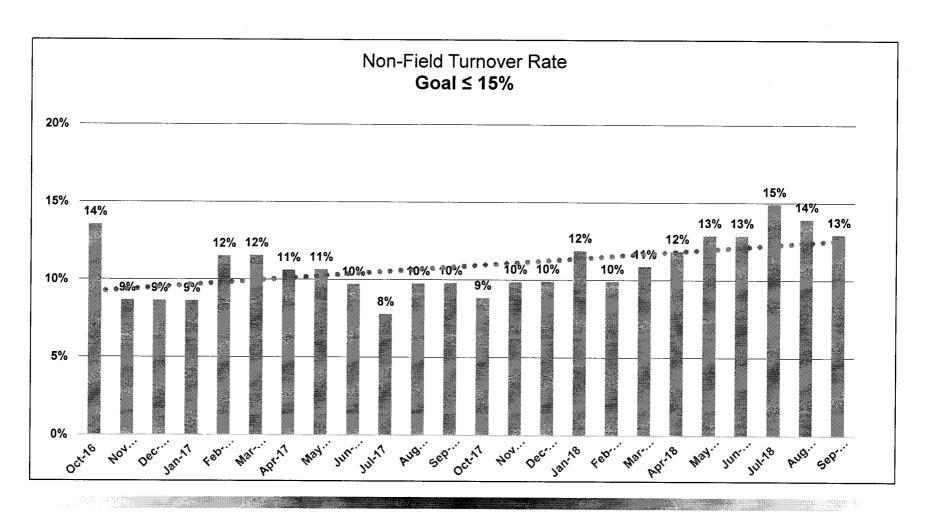


Alarm Turnover Rate



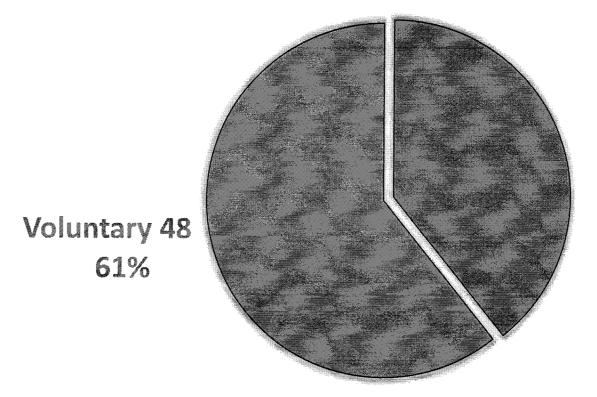


Non-Field Turnover Rate
